

CELEBRATION OF COMMUNION

One: God be with you.

All: And also with you.

One: Lift up your hearts.

All: We lift them up to God.

One: Let us give thanks to God.

All: It is right to give our thanks and praise.

One: We do give thanks to you, God of the Covenant,
for the gifts of creation and life. You divided the
light from the darkness and water from the dry
land. You made us in the image of yourself and
breathed into us the breath of life. Through the
waters of the Red Sea you delivered us from
suffering and servitude, and at the foot of your
sacred mountain you called us to truth and
holiness. In the words of your holy prophets you
called us to justice and compassion. Through the
lives of your blessed saints and martyrs you taught
us wisdom and faithfulness. And for the gift of
Jesus, the newness of your promise to us, the
brightness of our hope in you. Torn from the land

of the living for his witness to your holy teachings,
for fulfillment of your holy law and he became the
first fruit of earth in your kingdom, the One in
whom your will is done. So it is that we join with
those who have gone before us, with the angels of
the heavens, and with all who will follow us in the
holy community of faith, as we sing:

whom you would have us share your feast.

One: In Christ, God breaks down the walls that make us strangers to ourselves and divide us from one another.

All: We are the body of Christ.

One: At this table we bear witness to our faith.

All: At this table, God brings wholeness out of brokenness and healing to our world.

One: Let us break bread together.


